EDUCATIONAL - CLASS P

Rules and Suggestions

All exhibits to occupy wall space should be mounted on cards 22x28 inches and must be mounted so cards may be hung lengthwise. If any exhibit is too large for one card, use a larger card with the same multiple either in length or breadth or both dimensions of the regular 22x28 inch cardboard.

Entry will be judged on the basis of points, using the grades Superior, 5 points; Excellent, 3 points; Good, 1 point; and Fair, none recognition only. Premiums shall be prorated according to the total number of points given by the judges.

No premium will be awarded to mixed exhibits. Penmanship cards must contain only

penmanship work, etc. The work on the card may be the work of an individual, group, or school. The school work is entered in the name of the district and prizes are paid to the school as a whole.

All rural schools are required to exhibit not less than three, nor more than seven cards, and additional articles shall not exceed six entries. The first and second digits of any number represent the topic. The third and fourth digits represent the grade. If you exhibit more than one grades work on a card, use the digits thirteen under any topic. You must label work with the proper premium number.
